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#### About this document



This Easy Read document is a **consent form** to agree to take part in some **research** with the **Donald Beasley Institute.** 



A **consent form** is where you say you:

 have read the information you have been given about the research



- understand the information about the research
- agree to be part of the research.







**Research** is when we get a lot of information together about something so we can learn about it.

The **Donald Beasley Institute** is a place that researches things to do with disability.

They are based in Dunedin in New Zealand.

The Donald Beasley Institute is sometimes called the **DBI**.

- choosing if you want to take part
- being able to stop taking part at any time.

I understand that information about me will not be told to anyone else.



I understand that the research team will not talk to anyone else about what I have told them unless:

- I am in danger
- someone else is in danger.



I understand that the research team will talk to me first if they are worried about me.







I agree to my interviews being recorded.





I know who to contact if I have any questions about the research.





I understand that I will get a copy of the report at the end of the research.





I know the researchers might get in touch with me again if they need to ask me about the things I have said.
